HOUSEKEEPING

We now have units in various stages of turnaround, start-up, de-mob, and executing work. Maintaining a clean and organized work environment is of the utmost importance for preventing incidents and injuries.

Watch for hidden hazards:

- Objects such as tools, materials etc. hidden in folded blanket or left on leading edges.
- Pinch points/line of fire hazards
- Debris in half/full masks that have not been properly stored

Ensure all loads being transported via forklifts are properly secured. Do not stack or pile materials unevenly, high or leave them unsecured. They could topple over and become tripping hazards or dropped objects. Clean up your work area as you go. Be aware of surroundings and intervene when housekeeping and other hazards are observed.

Teamwork is the key to a clean work area. Good housekeeping reduces incidents, improves morale and increases efficiency.
