Daily Safety Focus **CHANGING CONDITIONS**

As Project Olympus gets closer to the end we will enter one of the most critical stages of the project in regards to safety.

Going forward this week and potentially into next week, we will be closing equipment, removing blinds & re-energizing equipment. Remember to ensure you have the correct permit, you have reviewed the procedure & ask operations personnel if there are any special instructions. When in doubt, ask again.

Things to be aware of:

- EHT (Electric Heat Tracing) and Steam Tracing that may have been isolated the shift previous but now is live.
- Steam will soon be introduced on many units piping that was cold, could now be hot, be aware of steam being bled off at some valve locations
- Electrical equipment that was once isolated may now be live.
- Scaffolding that was safe for use before coffee may now be red tagged & present an immediate danger.
- Be extra diligent entering flagged off areas be sure to read the flagging tags and understand the hazards within the flagged area.

Continue to enhance teamwork through identifying the steps, hazards and controls for your specific jobs. Identifying change, re--grouping, communicating and updating / modifying your controls.

Continue strong participation with crew reviews, keeping our heads in the game, IDENTIFYING change and meeting the challenge

Survey your work site, have a discussion with your crew reviewing timelines for activities that can realistically be achieved safely. Continue to maintain a Low Tolerance of Risk

We still have work left to complete, lets finish strong.
