## KEY LEARNINGS

On January 2, 2015 the wind caught the door of a front end loader pulling it from the operators hand. The force of the contact resulted in the window breaking. This could have easily resulted in injury to one of our workers. Remember that weather poses a hazard to us every day, it is important to remain aware of the current weather conditions and identify and mitigate any immediate hazards.
