## Permits

Safe Work Permits are a fundamental method of controlling and maintaining safe work conditions within Syncrude. It's a written agreement between the Permit Issuer and Permit Receiver, which authorizes specific work, at a specific location, for a specific duration.

Safe Work Permit Specifies; scope of work, conditions, preparations (i.e. isolations), potential hazards, controls and limitations, specifies the equipment system, building and/or area, identifies safety precautions to be followed, specifies the PPE that must be used, and indicates start and end times.

All Syncrude personnel, contractors, and vendor Representatives who do physical work at Syncrude are required to obtain a "Safe Work Permit" and get the **3 required signatures (Permit Issuer, Receiver, and Area Authority) before proceeding with work.**

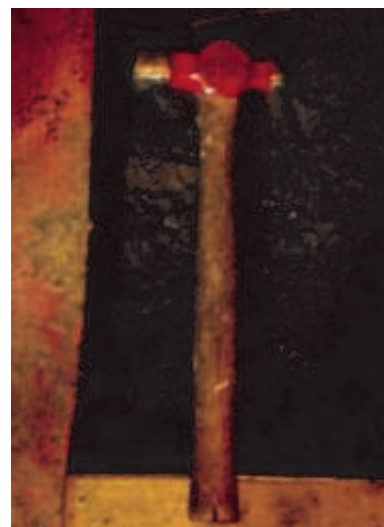

## KEY LEARNINGS

On March 31 a hammer was accidentally kicked through an eight inch hole with a six inch pipe extending through it that was missing its guard. At this point, the hammer fell approximately 40 feet to the ground below where two workers were standing nearby.

It is imperative that we put barriers in place to prevent objects from falling. Flag off the area below you, practice good housekeeping, and use fire blanket and lanyards where appropriate. Stop and take the time to identify any potential for a dropped object and address it prior to starting your task.
