DAILY FOCUS AT RISK BEHAVIORS

The following at risk behaviors have been observed:

- Not using the handrails when ascending and descending the stairs.
- Dropped tools.
- Tools and items placed on leading edges.
- Not wearing the required and specialty PPE.
- Housekeeping not being maintained.
- Taking shortcuts.

Lack of focus, complacency, rushing, fatigue and distractions are some of the contributing factors for our at risk behaviors. We need to concentrate on the task we are performing to recognize and avoid such hazards.

Breaking the Cycle of At Risk Behavior:

- Stop what you are doing and refocus, if you catch yourself in an unsafe state of mind like rushing, feeling frustrated or fatigued.
- Stays focused on the task at hand and stay out of the "Line of Fire".
- Ensure all required and specialty PPE is worn and in good condition.
- Keep your workplace neat and tidy.
- Peer to Peer interventions.
- Adopt a Safe Attitude and never compromise on Safety.

DID YOU KNOW

Dropped objects are consistently the third most frequent cause of fatality in the Oil and Gas Industry.

In the first 16 days of Olympus we have had 4 dropped objects, all 4 were hand tools, and 3 out of the 4 could have seriously injured the person standing next to you. Are you okay with that? **Stop accepting the risks, stop looking the other way, and stop taking chances.**
