DAILY FOCUS SPECIALTY PPE

Specialty PPE is required when a task poses higher potential for incident or injury. When working at heights it is encouraged that workers use hard hat lanyards, when using an impact or grinder double hearing protection and a face shield plus basic eye protection are required. Appropriate hand protection (at the very minimum all leather gloves) are required.

Specialty PPE requirements can be found on your permits, these are mandatory. However, we empower you to go above and beyond basic PPE as you see fit for the task you are doing.

If winds are high, wear above basic eye protection to prevent a foreign body from entering your eye. If you are working at heights, just because you aren't required to use a hard hat lanyard, doesn't mean you shouldn't. If the noise in an area is bothering you, wear ear plugs. Use your best judgment and go above the basics when you feel it is needed to protect yourself and others from injury. **It's not required, is not an excuse for not protecting yourself.**

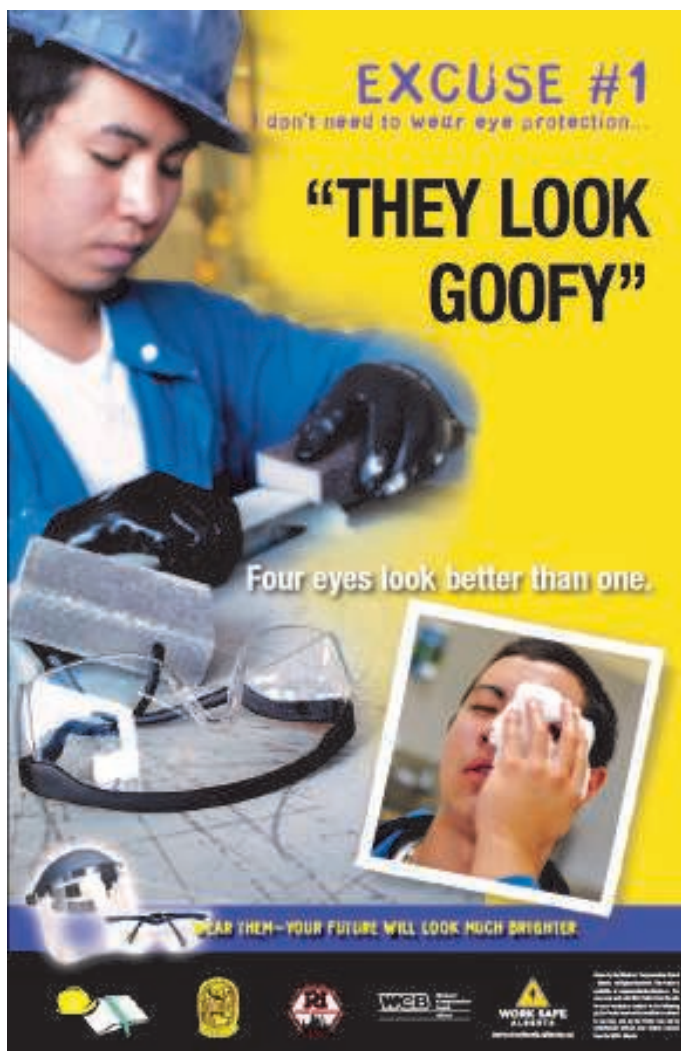

INTERACTION HIGHLIGHTS

- A worker was grinding when the second worker noticed the guard coming off the grinder. He intervened, stopping the work to make to tool safe before proceeding.
- A worker was standing in a crush zone, the operator made the worker aware of the danger and the worker moved out of the hazardous area.
- A worker was walking to their forklift in a PPE required area without safety glasses on, another worker stopped them and had them go get glasses.
- 11 interventions were done in transition zones (walking to and from camp between shifts) with workers not having their shoe laces tied.

Peer to peer interventions, no matter how minor they may seem are the key to putting an end to the injuries we are seeing happen. An untied shoe lace has the potential to cause a serious injury, while the intervention may seem trivial at the time, the potential for injury is not.
