STOP THE DROP!

In the past three days we have had four dropped objects within the Turnaround footprint. That is four opportunities to seriously injure someone. It is **IMPERITIVE** that we halt this trend before we fail at our goal of "Nobody Gets Hurt". Take the time to do the following:

- **CLEAN AND CLEAR** all work areas. There should be no loose tools, debris, material, bags, respirators or harnesses.
- **CONTAIN** all tools in an appropriate container when not in use
- **REMOVE** or properly suspend hoses and cords that impede movement and may result in a trip
- **CARRY** all tools in an approved bag or holster
- **SECURE** your radio in an approved holster
- **ABSOLUTELY NOTHING SHOULD BE STORED ON AN ELEVATED SURFACE** unless it is built to do so
- **EVALUATE** your work space before work, remove anything that may become dislodged, and re-evaluate frequently as the job progresses
- **DO NOT** allow material to build up as you work. Smaller items can become lost and be dislodged when you start to move things around.
- **REMOVE** all redundant fire blankets. If you don't need it for spark containment, don't put it on the ground – it can hide a hazard!

Remember, a dropped object has the potential to injure or kill the person on whom it falls. **STOP AND THINK. STOP THE DROP!**
