### SAFETY FOCUS: Hands in the Line of Fire!

To date we have had eight hand and finger related injuries. In the last week alone we have had five injuries related to hands being positioned "In the Line of Fire". Some of these incidents had increased severity potential; and *all* of these incidents were preventable.

Some of these injuries included:

- One worker was operating the drill and the other was clearing debris from the port. The right hand glove of the worker clearing the debris became pinched between the drill bit and wall of the port and his right index finger was injured.
- While Operator was changing out bag house bags on vacuum truck, operator placed right hand in the line of fire. Pinched Finger.
- Worker grinding on flange, disk cut through glove and 1/4" cut to hand.
- Worker caught thumb between the wrench and the flange or nut while removing studs.
- Worker caught finger in lunchroom door
- Working with a one inch impact removing studs/nuts. Worker had right hand on grating and when the nut came loose it fell and his hand was in the line of fire.

### **FOCUSED ACTION:**

Leaders – review this safety focus with your teams. Discuss:

- the behaviors that could have led to these incidents and ask: "What is the worst thing that could have happened?"
- Behaviors that could have prevented these incidents

Through peer-to-peer observations and leader tours, focus observations and conversations on line of fire hazards related to the work that is being performed. Have the workers identify where their safe zones are to prevent line or fire and pinch point injuries.
