## SAFETY FOCUS: Communicate Your Hazards

Every day at work you must ensure you are aware of what is happening around you; and you must understand how information, events, and your own actions will impact the safety of those working in the same area as you.

Failure to adequately communicate the hazards you are creating for others in your immediate vicinity can be a contributing factor in incidents attributed to human error. Those who practice good hazard communication are also known to possess a "360° mindset."

No job is hazard free. In order to ensure the safety of your co-workers it is important to share information with them. When putting up flagging, don't forget to hang a tag on it. Ensure that the information on the tag clearly identifies the hazard it is there to make others aware of, and include a name and number to contact for more information. When working in proximity with others, talk to them about their job and area hazards. Make sure they are aware of yours. Have a plan to keep each other safe. Would you send your child onto a busy road without the information they need to cross safely? Treat your co-workers like your family.
